There are so many benefits to driving an electric car: significantly lower emissions, much cheaper to run and maintain, fun to drive, cleaner air and quieter neighbourhoods.



### FIRES TO FLOURISH FUNDS SOUTH COAST COMMUNITY KITCHEN + SHASA FOOD PROGRAM

This collaborative food program provides a bag of food to 60 families each week.

Fires to Flourish has provided SHASA with \$78,200 to purchase:

• a second hand Nissan EV 200 van

• two years of registration and insurance for the van

• install of a solar system and EV charger for the van

- promotional magnets for the van
- four fridges/freezers to enable better storage of food
- a coordinator to run some local feasts for volunteers and clients of the food program
  - food for the local feasts

This will significantly cut the costs of collecting food from supermarkets, bringing it to a location for sorting and then delivering to people's homes.




### VALE LEI PARKER

## Anglican Parish Batemans Bay heatwave haven

SHASA has secured \$24,680 in FRRR Strengthening Rural Communities funding (Federal Government) to install a rooftop solar system and upgrade to LED lighting for the Anglican Parish Batemans Bay hall. These measures (Stage 1), will help to significantly reduce operational costs.



# Australia could save \$8 billion every year by changing more light globes

Efficient lighting is one of the easiest, ready-to-implement technologies that can help transition to a low carbon economy.

Since the early 2000s, Australia has managed to replace about half of our traditional incandescent light globes – 'tubes and bulbs' – with LED lights. If we managed to swap out the remaining 50 per cent, we could save about \$AUD8 billion every year in electricity costs, and nearly 8 million tonnes of carbon dioxide.

Electricity saved on lighting can free up electricity that can help add and accelerate electrification of heating and transport.

Australia could power 3.8 million heat pumps, 4.4 million electric vehicles, or 5.2 million electric cooking units each year with the electricity saved from more efficient lighting.

Australian households with 10 incandescent halogen lamps at home will spend more than \$200 per year on lighting electricity costs. Replacing those with the most efficient LEDs now available reduces it to a little over \$10! Win/win!
