Peace of mind comes with being prepared for anything you can reasonably expect to happen over an Australian Summer. The Eurobodalla - like other parts of Coastal Australia - has experienced major bushfires, floods, and storms. Rising temperatures mean that these events are likely to be more frequent, and more intense, in the future. So, what can you do about it? You can make a plan, by yourself, with your household, or in your neighbourhood or community.

People who experienced those emergencies last time tell us that having a plan in place meant they were able to respond faster, were less likely to experience loss that can't be repaired, and report better mental health one to five years later.

Do you have a plan for your household? If you had to leave your home, where would you head for? What would you take with you? How about pets? Does anyone need regular medications? Special equipment? At what point would you decide to leave?





SOUTHERN LIFE CHURCH - THE EUROBODALLA'S LARGEST BUSHFIRE AND HEATWAVE HAVEN


Thanks to a grant of \$168,668 (GST inclusive) from Club Grants 3 (Infrastructural Grants) NSW Government, SHASA has been upgrading the Southern Life Church Food Hall and Church Hall to operate as a Haven during extreme weather events for clients of The Pantry, Church members and their families. Works included:


- 29.92kW solar PV system and 20kWh battery on the Church Building
- 26.4kW solar PV system and 40kWh battery on the Food Hall
- Starlink satellite and training
- 4 internal air filters
- 2 fire pumps, 4 fire hoses and fittings
- Back up generator for the Food Hall


LONG-TERM PARTNERSHIP DRIVES COMMUNITY SUCCESS



The team from Micro Energy Systems has again demonstrated their commitment to sustainable community development through recent successful installations in the Eurobodalla region. Their long term partnership with SHASA continues to deliver more projects supporting local organisations to reduce their environmental footprint.

The team from Micro Energy Systems commits to supporting these organisations as long-term customers, with ongoing service over the next 10-15 years. This enduring partnership allows SHASA to confidently continue providing innovative, sustainable solutions that empower our community.





Southern Life Church: A Solar and Storage Milestone

Recently, Micro Energy Systems completed a significant upgrade at Southern Life Church, installing photovoltaic (PV) solar and battery storage systems. Despite being on separate buildings, these systems are connected behind the same meter and have been cleverly configured to operate seamlessly via monitoring programming, maximizing energy efficiency and cost savings.

Further enhancements are underway, with scheduled upgrades to the electrical infrastructure aimed at improving resilience and enabling emergency power supply for essential circuits across both buildings. In a generous gesture, Micro Energy Systems has donated \$5,000 to SHASA's public fund to support these critical upgrades, reinforcing their commitment to long-term community sustainability.

SHASA PUBLIC FUND - YOUR MONEY AT WORK

The book fosters understanding, normalises emergency planning, and equips families with practical strategies to reduce anxiety and improve readiness before and during disasters.





Australian secondhand Battery Electric Car sales surge in first half of 2025


BEVs took a record share of the secondhand market in the first half of 2025, with sales up 92.2% on the same period in 2024.



Despite a drop in demand for passenger cars in the wider used market, used BEVs have seen 16,398 units sold this year to date, up 92.2% on the same period in 2024. The number of secondhand BEVs available on the second-hand market rose 88.9%, from 9,848 on the market in the first half of

2024, to 17,914 this year.





New EV sales hit a record high in 2024 and, according to a report by JOLT, Australia is on track to surpass 300,000 EVs on the road by the end of this year. Owning an EV is increasingly affordable, through secondhand sales and state-specific incentives and financial incentives for EV buyers, including the Electric Car Discount legislation, as well as green loans from the Australian government's green bank, Clean Energy Finance Corporation (CEFC).

To support EV uptake across the country, the Australian government recently launched a new website dedicated to provide information to Australians about buying, owning, and maintaining an EV. This includes EV basics, such as types of vehicles, as well as the necessary knowledge about EV charging infrastructure, whether that be at home, kerbside, private or public







FUNDING ENERGY UPGRADES TO SOCIAL HOUSING

Funding energy upgrades to social housing to cut bills and tackle climate change

The Albanese and Minns Labor Governments are partnering with 22 Community Housing providers to upgrade thousands of social housing homes to make them cheaper to run, more comfortable to live in, and better for the environment.

These upgrades will deliver lasting cost of living relief, while making renewable and smart energy features more accessible.

More than 2,300 homes will be upgraded with nearly \$18 million in joint funding from the Australian and NSW Governments, as well as Community Housing Providers.


The upgrades will include a range of potential measures:

- rooftop solar panels and shared solar systems
- reverse cycle air conditioning
- energy-efficient hot water systems
- ceiling insulation, window shading and draught proofing
- LED lighting and ceiling fans.

These upgrades will help keep homes warmer in winter, cooler in summer and make them cheaper to run. It will help vulnerable households save on energy bills while cutting emissions across the state.

In an emergency, you often don't have time to think, let alone pack. By packing a survival kit in advance, you can save yourself a lot of time and stress. There are lots of suggestions on line if you search for Bug Out Bags or Grab and Go bags. Everyone's bag will be different, but the process of packing yours will help you to make sure that the things you really need will be to hand and ready when you need to leave. Think about your essential documents, irreplaceable sentimental objects, pets and their supplies, children and their needs. If you plan to see out the emergency in your home, your bag might be a box of non-perishable food and plenty of drinking water in your pantry or garage.

Get Ready Weekend at your local RFS shed. Weekend 21-22 September


Would you like to find out more? There are many opportunities to learn about preparing your home and household. The Rural Fire Service has a Get Ready Weekend on 21-22 September - check what's on at your local RFS Shed.







There are also several apps for your smartphone that will help you to keep in touch with what's going on - during emergencies, ABC Radio South East is our official emergency broadcaster so you need to be able to tune in. A battery radio is extremely helpful, with back up batteries stored outside of the appliance. You can also get radio on your phone with the ABC Listen app.
